BIOGRAPHY

In year 2003, I graduated BA Level from a 5-year Industrial Design bachelor program at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand. After I had my hands on clay for the first time in a compulsory ceramic class in my second year, I was hooked. This had led me to Ceramic major and my exam project. Ceramic can keep my concentration span extraordinary lengthy. Patience was not the word, for there is nothing to tolerate. My degree project, 'Anti-black box', ceramic furniture, has outstretched the potential use of local clays using experimental processes that crossed between design discipline and art discipline.

In the same year, my career began as a ceramic designer at Mae Fah Laung Foundation, a royal patron project to raise quality of life of Thailand's ethnic minorities in Doi Tung area. I could surely design, directly based on the popular trend with the local resources. However, I became aware that I knew very little about marketing that influenced designs. My urge to understand market mechanism of luxury products was rising.

In order to deepen my perspective, I left Mae Fah Laung in 2005 to work as a concept designer and visual merchandiser at 'Panpuri', a high-end spa product, which was on the rise with a great marketing success story. While my design was very successful as they answered the market's demand, I could not help being unfulfilled.

During that time, I simultaneously worked as an assistant of Pim Sudhikam, my former ceramic professor whom my admiration in ceramic conceived from. Her hands-on and down-to-earth approach had led me to discover my happiness in the 'making process' rather than the end product. This was the ground of my ambition to live my life as a ceramic practitioner.

In 2006, it usually doesn't take long for an extreme consumerism and capitalism to wear ones out. It happened to me with no exception. I was 29 and I turned myself to a volunteer designer in community development of Thai volunteer network. I had a chance to create an events called 'Crack: Artistic flowers in the park", which invited almost a hundred artists to crate and donate their work of art in order to enable the general public to appreciate an art exhibition that encourages social contributions and peace within Thai society at that moment. At the same time, I determined to save up money for a Ceramics course that would expand my 'hands-on skill. Scandinavia was my destination.

In 2008, I started at Capellagården, Craft school in south of Sweden to build up my ceramic craft foundation. I then proceeded to M.F.A. at HDK School of Design and Crafts in the following year to refine artistic and research qualities.

Just before I took off to Sweden, my life was bombarded with several miseries and I had to find ways to deal with them. Fortunately, at HDK, I met one of my mentor, Morten Løbner Espersen. He taught me 'to query' and 'to observe' myself. It was also in those days that I volunteered in retreat camps of the Zen master Thich Nhat Hanh. His key teaching was through mindfulness, we could learn to live happily in the present moment - the only way to truly develop peace, both in one's self and in the world. From the 2nd semester on, I delved into Buddhism philosophy and integrated mindfulness in order to 'query' and 'observe' my work. This had essentially outlined my attribute as a ceramicist.

Repetition was my device to practice mindfulness. With mindfulness in every motion, I can achieve total concentration of the present, preventing my mind to wander off into all my

troubles and therefore make them smaller and distanced from my life. Moreover, the power of mindfulness has loosened me up in trying to control the clay for perfection. This allowed me to let the clay 'be' and learned to work with its natural self.

'Repetition', the root of mindfulness, and 'inherence of the very nature of things' together had formed what worked for me as a step-by-step process for methodical efficiency that leads to originality. The steps are however not determined, as the next step only reveals itself when the former step was fulfilled. The process was in fact my achievement. The outcome, an attestation of the process, then appeared in bodily form that perhaps would voice my findings to public -- a new artwork. This morphing process from controlling to letting go was rewarding. For the first time, I felt so content. I found my peace.

This practice was depicted in my degree project 'Weaving indigo: Let's sway and see it goes' in 2011. The work was awarded Ann Wall's design award from Svenskt Tenns in Stockholm, a grant from Kerstin Wijk-Broström Foundation in Gothenburg, and Samlade Fonderna from Gothenburg Crafts Association. The piece later won Honorable prize, 10th International Ceramic competition Mino, Japan in 2014.

The birth of Small Studio

After graduated from HDK at the end of 2011, I headed home to Thailand, In 2013, I set up a ceramic studio in Bangkok, 'Small Studio'. This is where I practice and produce new works. It occasionally welcomes visitors for workshops. I also work as a lecturer of Ceramics studios at Chulalongkorn University where I graduated from 11 years ago.

'Small Studio' is a workplace to share skills and perspectives, promoting ceramic practice as a manner that accommodates to urban lifestyle. The project was crowd funded within 48 hours, an evident of the need for ceramic art and craft in Thai society. This is the result of the rise in Buddhist interests in the mists of exploitative capitalism and shopping craze. The new generation of Thais are tired of their ready made but empty lives. Ceramic workshops, provided by me and other fellow ceramists, proved to be very popular. Moreover, I see a growing numbers of enthusiastic young people asking to be an apprentice potter. This warms my heart.

To this date in 2015, my happiness is to wake up and go to Small Studio for a long-hour work day, producing new work at my pace, keeping up with participating with contemporary ceramic galleries around the world, both solo and group exhibitions. Last but not least, I notice that ceramic and other craft forms can spark off self-reflecting talks, shared between people in workshops and exhibitions. I will continue my work's approach to enhance this recognition of this power of ceramic, while keeping on refining myself. For I believe that pottering can lead to self-completion, what is currently hard to find in the city like Bangkok and many more alike.
