Diana Dávila (http://www.mapr.org/es/museo/proa/artista/davila-casasnovas diana) spent her childhood and youth between Guaynabo and Dorado. She got the seed of creativity from her mother and father. She remembers how she watched her father take painting classes by mail. Her house was a space for creation and the beach house in Dorado was the place to connect with her spirituality. During high school she met Yolanda Pastrana, her art teacher that brings her to the design and color theory. It was in Puerto Rico that she made the decision to be a visual artist and make her formal studies in Philadelphia. Her artistic training continued after completing her studies in the United States. When she arrived in Puerto Rico, she held her first solo exhibition at Liga de Arte de San Juan where she connected with established artists.
