



I have an ongoing feeling, that under the forces of life, we are all looking for sanctuary for our body and soul, to be silent and safe for a minute, to rest for a while. My work deals with this wish for shelter, even if only physical and insufficient.




"Shelter" Hand built - slabs and coils, stoneware 16X12X17 Photography — Youval Hai


