Finally Norwegian Crafts, in partnership with Suzhou Jinji Lake Art Museum and KODE - Art Museums of Bergen, can now welcome the public to experience the exhibition *Beyond G(l)aze!* 

In spring 2012, Norwegian Crafts received an e-mail from the ceramic artist and curator Heidi Bjørgan. She wrote on behalf of a curatorial team who launched the idea of creating an exhibition of Norwegian and Chinese ceramics. Since then, we have been allowed to participate in an adventure, not least through collaborating with the four curators Heidi Bjørgan, Feng Boyi, Wang Dong and Bjørn Inge Follevaag. It is therefore also very interesting to read the curators' reflections in this catalogue, where they tell about their experiences and what they have learned during the process.

The curators of course also tell about the sixteen participating artists. Norwegian Crafts is proud to be able to present an exhibition featuring works by Ingrid Askeland, Lu Bin, Feng Feng, Liu Danhua, Huang Huanyi, Liu Jianhua, Stein Haga Kristensen, Torbjørn Kvasbø, Nils Martin, Anne Helen Mydland, Irene Nordli, Linn Pedersen, Lu Pinchang, Corrina Thornton, Ai Weiwei and Chen Xiaodan. The curators have chosen ceramic works that represent both similarities and differences between two cultures which we perhaps think of as very different. The exhibition shows how clay materials as expressive media hold a strong position in contemporary art. And as the title indicates, we are invited to explore the role of ceramic works as conveyors of meaning.
