## about the work

Ruby Jhunjhunwala, a Ceramic \& Mixed Media Artist of international repute, dwells into her youth to pick up threads of memories created using different media, and incorporates them into the exhibition.

MATERIALS:
Jute Nets used by the Indian army for camouflaging their trucks, manjarpat (Unbleached cotton fabric), Cotton thread, Unglazed ceramic mutthis from our various Mutthi Sessions.

Stitch by Stitch

DIMENSIONS:
$2 \mathrm{ft} \times 2 \mathrm{ft}$
MATERIALS:
Unglazed stoneware, Cast iron, Galvanized wire.



## simple as this

DIMENSIONS:
$4.5 \mathrm{ft} \times 1 \mathrm{ft}$

MATERIALS:
Cotton rope dyed in tea, Cotton thread, Glazed ceramic, Tin and Wood frame.



## through the veil of time - 1

DIMENSIONS:
$3 \mathrm{ft} \times 2 \mathrm{ft}$
MATERIALS:
Unglazed stoneware and porcelain.



## through the veil of time - 2

DIMENSIONS:
$2 \mathrm{ft} \times 1 \mathrm{ft}$

MATERIALS:
Unglazed porcelain and stoneware.



## a road less travelled

DIMENSIONS:
$1 \mathrm{ft} \times 1.5 \mathrm{ft} \times 3$ inches
MATERIALS:
Soda fired porcelain and stoneware.



## it hurts

DIMENSIONS:
$1.5 \mathrm{ft} \times 10$ inches $\times 4$ inches

## MATERIALS:

Glazed porcelain and stoneware.



## less travelled

DIMENSIONS:
$1 \mathrm{ft} \times 7$ inches
MATERIALS
Soda fired porcelain and stoneware.



## just a ripple

DIMENSIONS:
$3 \mathrm{ft} \times 3 \mathrm{ft} \times 1 \mathrm{ft}$

MATERIALS:
Glazed and unglazed stoneware, Nylon thread, Wood.

## a step ahead

Wet clay scrolls scrunched together by Special children and their families, during a Mutthi session.

DIMENSIONS:
$6 \mathrm{ft} \times 4 \mathrm{ft} \times 8$ inches
MATERIALS:
Glazed stoneware, Copper wire.



## can links be open?

The artist has taken the neglected pieces of iron links at The Mills and recreated the form in fragile stoneware ceramic. This piece invariably bridges the gap between the 2 entities: strength and fragility.

## DIMENSIONS

$12 \mathrm{ft} \times 2 \mathrm{ft}$

MATERIALS:
Glazed and unglazed stoneware, Cast iron links,




## abstraction

The artist has explored an alternative firing technique called "Obvara", in these woven clay patches.

DIMENSIONS:
$8 \mathrm{ft} \times 2 \mathrm{ft}$
MATERIALS:
Stoneware and porcelain clay, Copper wire, Iron pipes.

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## where is the weft?

DIMENSIONS:
$7 \mathrm{ft} \times 6 \mathrm{ft} \times 4$ inches
MATERIALS:
Unglazed porcelain, Cotton thread, Sleeper wood.



## gradient elegance



## no begining, no end

DIMENSIONS:
$7 \mathrm{ft} \times 8$ inches
MATERIALS:
Glazed/ unglazed stoneware, Thread, Copper wire, Cast iron rod from The Mills.



## fragile strength

The fragile clay slivers find their balance and beauty in the strong base that hold them together.

The work is symbolic of life's contradictions.

DIMENSIONS:
$4 \mathrm{ft} \times 1 \mathrm{ft} \times 8$ inches
MATERIALS:
Glazed and unglazed stoneware, Wood, Copper wire


## untold stories Life is a series of stories...

DIMENSIONS:
$19 \mathrm{ft} \times 3 \mathrm{ft}$
MATERIALS:
Rejected blockprinted cotton cloth,
Thin stripes of unbleached cotton stitched closely to give a layered texture to the work.
