Andrea Lallana was born in Córdoba, Argentina, and she attended law school at the National University located in her hometown. In 1992, she transferred to Valparaiso, Chile where she began to participate in diverse courses, seminars, and ceramic workshops. After twelve years she moved to Reñaca, where she currently resides. Her home, which also holds her workshop, is immersed within a forested countryside surrounded by lush vegetation, fauna, and earthy minerals. Engulfed by the sounds of singing birds, seeds that mutate into plants and mountains, and hillsides that reveal the worldly and temporary vastness that we inhabit, she dedicates herself to her works and to transmit her passion for the ceramic process.

Her creations are the fruit of the empathic relationship she holds with her natural environment, particularly with ceramic materiality. She designates long periods to observation and exploration, rituals that have increased her knowledge and sensibility regarding the logic that governs the mineral, plant, and animal kingdom.

A deep connection is manifested in works that seem to be extracts from nature with a complete absence of humankind. Details and textures are inspired by the prints left behind by the power of a river current, the robustness of plant growth, the actions of specific animals, or even the definitions of geological strata shaped by lengthy periods of time that exceed existence. It brings us closer to a material language where different forms of existence govern.

In her creations there is also evidence of a motivation to show the evolution of ceramic behaviors in response to the actions and decisions taken by the ceramist. Acid etching eats away at the surface; tensions, cracks and fractures between different clays, or reactions, will result in textures whose directions and intensities will depend on the logic of the material. Allowing the material to act and display its textural and formal capacities, invites us to think about ceramic materiality no longer as a raw and inactive material, but as an agent with a productive and generative force, manifesting what the philosopher Latour calls the power to act.

In any of its forms, Lallana displaces traditional modeling and technical skills used for ceramic works, to give way to shapes and textures that reside in nature, particularly in ceramic materiality. Hence, her work results in a shared protagonism between matter-artist and invites us to delve into the logics of the natural and material world.
