I was born in Santiago, Chile where I live now. I am completing my studies at the Architecture School on "The Pontificia University Catolica of Chile". Since 1980 to 2008 I was dedicated to oil painting, participating in many workshops, groups and individual exhibitions. All of the above led me to a training even from painting, in my current gaze and work. Mimesis at first, then abstraction, the study of color and composition. Elements that I should have understood before working freely in sculpture. This training shows me that everything is already done, we don't create anything, everything is in our environment. All we can do is reinterpret reality and what we observe. I was identified by "The ceramics of rupture" contemporary movement where the important thing is matter and unconventional construction methods
