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Biographical

Born in Xalapa, Mexico in 1955. She entered the Talleres libres of the Universidad Veracruzana. María Bofill, Kitoichi Kishimoto, Javier Cervantes, Enrique Mestre, Juan Ortí, Graciela Olio, Toni Hambleton, are among the teachers who have contributed to her training as a ceramist. Her works have been exhibited in different museums and cultural centers in Mexico, Croatia, Yugoslavia, Denmark, and Canada. She has presented her work in more than 25 collective exhibitions and 23 individual exhibitions.

She has made artistic residencies in Mexico and abroad: in 2016, Escuela Nacional de Cerámica, Tapalpa, Jalisco, México. 2006 Pilchuck Glass School, Seattle, United States. 2004 Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity, Canada. 2002, 29th International Symposium World of Ceramics in Arandjelovac, Yugoslavia.

She has been awarded several scholarships: in 1996 she obtained the scholarship for the creation of her work with the project "Vasijas" of the Programa de Estímulo a la Creación y Desarrollo Artístico de Veracruz. In 2012 with the project "Recoger Flores" the Creadores con Trayectoria IVEC-CONACULTA scholarship.

Since 2003 she was part of the advisory committee of the Bienal de Cerámica Utilitaria of the Franz Mayer Museum, in Mexico City. In 2013 she acted as a jury of the 6th. Edition of this Biennial. In 2014 she received the Premio Nacional de la Cerámica "Galardón Pantaleón Panduro" for her career, work and outstanding national contribution to enrich the ceramic cultural heritage of the country, in San Pedro Tlaquepaque, Jalisco. In 2016 she was recognized with the Premio Nacional de la Cerámica, Sculpture category, in San Pedro Tlaquepaque, Jalisco.

From 2006 to 2008 she was responsible for the ceramic workshop for children and young people with disabilities, at the Centro de Desarrollo Integral Artístico (CEDAI) of the Instituto Veracruzano de la Cultura in Xalapa, Veracruz. In 2010, she was director and teacher in ceramics at El Taller, a training, and production center for children and young people with disabilities in Xalapa, Veracruz.

For 35 years she founded her ceramic workshop Mariana Velázquez located in Zoncuantla, Coatepec, Veracruz, where she creates her personal work, teaches young people and adults; organizes seminars for young people with disabilities and advises other plastic artists.

In his ceramic workshop, she has organized courses with Mexican and foreign potters of recognized trajectory such as Javier del Cueto, Graciela Olio, Rafa Pérez and María Bofill, among others.
