Biography

Krisztina Szente is a Hungarian ceramic artist known for her masterful fusion of traditional folk pottery and contemporary porcelain design. She began her career focusing on Hungarian folk ceramics, with a particular focus on traditional cake pans inspired by Transdanubian motifs. Her creations have been recognized by the Hungarian Folk Applied Art Jury and have won numerous awards, including the prestigious Masterpiece of Hungarian Craft award on several occasions.

In 2002, she founded her own workshop in Dabas, and moved to Szentendre in 2016. Her studio, located in a classic Szentendre house on Gőzhajó Street, serves as both a gallery and a creative space.

Over the past decade, she has broadened her artistic horizons as a guest lecturer at the Hubei Institute of Fine Arts, in Wuhan, China. This experience allowed her to experiment with various local clays and porcelains, which has deeply influenced her artistic direction. These experiences inspired her to focus on contemporary porcelain creations, emphasizing the airy simplicity and natural beauty of the material. Her innovative approach culminated in the "Lotus Flower" collection, with which she won a gold medal at a porcelain design competition in Dehua. China in 2022.

In addition to her artistic endeavors, she is an active member of the Hungarian Folk Applied Arts Jury Committee and President of the Szentendre Ceramic Artists Association. Her works are included in both domestic and international public collections, reflecting her significant contribution to the field of ceramic art.
