Biography

I studied Illustration at the University of Wolverhampton in 1993 before qualifying as a teacher in 1997. I retrained in ceramics on a Masters programme at UWIC, Cardiff in 2003. Since then I have practised as a ceramic artist, exhibiting my work nationally and internationally. In 2010 I completed a PhD which examined the spatial effects of colour on the three-dimensional conical form.

The development of my work into ceramics, colour and spatial perception began with a Masters degree at Cardiff in 2003. Through the work I explore the ways in which spaces within landscape appear altered depending on the ever-changing colours of season, weather and time. The conical forms act as canvases for paintings in which landscape scenes are distilled into bands, perceptibly altering the size, depth and shape of the form by the applied colour. The forms can be made to seem wider or narrower, deeper or shallower, heavier or lighter, or they may appear to undulate and bend, or vibrate and hover by the juxtaposition of finer lines. The viewing of both inner and outer surfaces together enables me to exploit colour connections and visual play from one side to another.

Notions above were the topic of 18 months studio practice before embarking on a PhD in March 2006. I undertook this in order to develop the ideas with more emphasis upon the spatial phenomena in relation to colour theory. I found that colours behave differently when viewed across three-dimensional space than on a two-dimensional surface, particularly on the inner bowl form where illusions can appear much stronger. For example, the concave inner space may appear flat by the application of a single matt hue, and where two wide bands are situated on the same internal surface an apparent bend appears at their juncture.
