Biography

Childhood

Corrie Bain was born in 1979 in Great Britain (UK). She is the daughter of studio potter Alan Bain, a graduate of Glasgow School of Art. Her parents owned a residential pottery school called Lyth Ceramic Workshop in Caithness, in Northern Scotland for 15 years.

Greece

In 1987, her family emigrated to Greece and founded an international residential summer school called Candili Mountain Pottery on the Achmetaga estate in the village of Prokopi, on the island of Euboia. The pottery had been unused for several years and was in need of new tenants. Corrie helped out as an assistant in the pottery from the age of 7, and taught her first class to a group of Dutch students when she was 18.

The estate is a retreat where ceramics, seminars for the arts, culture and education are held, owned by Francis Noel Baker, who since the 70's used to invite potters such as Bernard Leach to give workshops, and research the local clay and mines.

Early Influences

She was influenced and surrounded by ceramicists and artists such as George Wyllie, Pip Hammond and Alex Leckie, her father's ceramics teacher. Alex was a lecturer in Ceramics and Sculpture at the South Australian School of Art in Adelaide from 1956 to 1962, and Senior Lecturer in charge of Ceramics at Glasgow school of Art for 16 years, between 1966-1982. He was known for his large-scale installations in Australia. He emigrated to Greece in 1992 and set up a pottery alongside Alan Bain on the estate. Corrie became Alex's assistant and he taught her how to make large, handbuilt sculptural works, and plaster moulds. Some of the students whom she grew up learning from are ceramists such as David Whitehead (La Borne), Roz Herrin (La Borne), Patrick King (Switzerland), Brigitta Briner King (Switzerland), Terry Davis (Italy), Stef Baxter (England), Ashraf Hanna (Egypt/London) and Sue Hanna (London).

Professional life

Europe

After graduating from Edinburgh College of Art, and Alfred University, Corrie Bain exhibited at the 'New Designers' Exhibition in London in 2003, and began exhibiting in galleries throughout Scotland, England, Italy, Crete, and Greece. She founded and ran a residential summer school called Limni Ceramics Centre in Greece, and taught ceramics full time from 2003-2006. She produced work for the Benaki Museum Gallery in Athens between 2004-2008. In Greece she experimented with a wide variety of high-firing techniques, learning how to build kilns and firing reduction, oxidation, salt, wood, saggar, pit, raku, smoke, and black firing kilns, whilst continuing to exhibit her work internationally.

Korea

In 2007 she emigrated to South Korea for two years, to study Korean, and learn from local Korean Master ceramicists in the village of Anseong-si in Gyeonggi-do Province. She visited many local workshops, and attended classes with master ceramicists such as Lee Yeounhyu, Lee In Chin, Lee Kang Hyo, Yoo Kwangyul, and Han Ho Hyon. She attended the Gyeonggi International Ceramic Biennale in 2007 and 2009 as a visiting artist, where she networked with international ceramic artists including Hyejeong Kim, Phil Rogers, Janet Mansfield, and John Britt. She met Lee In Chin at the Biennale, and after visiting him in his home studio in Anseong-si, in the village where she lived, he became instrumental in inspiring her to make Korean ceramics and Buncheong ware. After South Korea, she travelled to North Korea, China, Japan, and Thailand to research celadon glazes and the history of oriental ceramics.

China

In China she travelled to Beijing, Xian, Yunnan, Yixing, and attended workshops at 'The Pottery Workshop' and the 'Sanbao Ceramic Art Institute' in Jingdezhen. She learnt how to throw with porcelain clay in Jingdezhen.

Japan

By recommendation of Phil Rogers and Korean ceramist Hyejeong Kim, Corrie met Shoji Hamada's grandson Tomoo Hamada and attended workshops with him and Ken Matsuzaki in the pottery village of Mashiko in Japan. She continued researching oriental philosophy and ceramics in both Bizen and Kyoto.

Barcelona

Since moving back to Europe to live in Barcelona, Corrie continued to study ceramics with English ceramist Seth Cardew, her teacher and mentor. Since then she has taken workshops with Marcia Selsor, Jane Jermyn, Shamai Sam Gibsh, Esther Beck, Steve Hilton, Adil Writer, Robert Lawarre, Antoinette Badenhorst, and Alberto Bustos.

<u>Current works</u>

Corrie makes sculptural and semi-functional ceramics in a range of different high-firing clays including porcelain, white stoneware, and black stoneware. She has made many large-scale sculptural installations including figurative, conceptual, socio-political works related to the Syrian refugee crisis, environmental issues, and Brexit. The 'Seed Pod Collection' which she began making in 2004, finds inspiration from cymatics, microscopic images of seed pods, micro-organisms, pollen and fractals.

Chelsea Flower Show

Currently, she is producing works for Chelsea Flower show in London after being selected by the Royal Horticultural Society to exhibit and her work in the Artisan Studios demonstrating the step-by-step process involved in making the Seed Pod pieces from Limoges Porcelain. Each decorative element is added in very thin, individual layers called lamellae, until the surface is partially or fully covered with texture.

Gyeonggi International Ceramic Biennale

In 2019, she has been selected as one of the **302 artists** chosen to lead The Gyeonggi International Ceramic Biennale in Korea. She will travel to Korea again, where she hopes to make new connections, re-connect with old friends and acquaintances, and demonstrate her techniques.

International Competition of l'Alcora

Her piece entitled 'Blue Cycus Llamelae' has been selected for entry to CICA2019, The 39th International Competition of l'Alcora, Spain.

Artists Statement

'I use the vessel as a sculptural form of expression, and the surface as a canvas for my drawings'

"The ceramics I make are related to an ongoing exploration of visual dynamics, kinetics and movement. They are abstract, sculptural pieces that find inspiration from Cymatics, the scientific study of wave phenomena, microscopic imagery of seed pods, pollen and fractals. The 'Seed Pod Collection' are miniature time capsules of life, portraying the process of growth and decay, the beginning and end of a plant's life cycle. Mark-making, texture and decoration are equally as important as form. I attempt to make pieces that allude to a sense of weightlessness, in search of fundamental elements of nature, rhythm and balance"
