Publication: Reinterpreting Tea Bowls and Tea Spaces through Historical and Contemporary Dialogues




This publication offers a reflective exploration of how tea bowls are inseparable from the architectural and philosophical context in which they are used. Drawing from the legacies of seminal figures such as Murata Shuko, Oda Nobunaga, Sen no Rikyu, Furuta Oribe, and Hon'ami Koetsu, the book examines the intricate relationship between vessel and space. It further extends this inquiry into the present, engaging with contemporary tea practice and tea room architecture.

By presenting the tea bowl not as an isolated object but as part of an evolving spatial and cultural narrative, the work contributes to a deeper understanding of *Chanoyu* as a holistic aesthetic system.
