Adhering to the theme of the conference, CURRENT, Antra Sinha and Khanjan Dalal have invited artists from diverse cultural identities to respond to the idea of ash from their cultural traditions or individual daily life as an interpretation in their work. We seek to explore the underlying force which motivates artists to create with this idea - Raakh which is the Hindi word for 'ash'.
