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Nicole Seisler (b. 1982) is a ceramic artist who creates sculpture, installation, public art, and public programs that investigate time. materiality, process, community and the overlapping artist/viewer/participant/collaborator. Nicole received her MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago (SAIC) and her BFA from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. She has exhibited at venues including the Museum of Contemporary Photography, Chicago IL; Museum of Fine Arts, Boston MA; Museum of Fine Arts, Tallahassee FL; Armory Arts Center, West Palm Beach FL; Alto Galleria, Brussels, Belgium; Flash Atoyle, Izmir, Turkey; Craft Contemporary, Los Angeles CA; and she has an upcoming solo exhibition at AMOCA, Pomona CA. Reviews of Nicole's work have been published in the New York Times, the Los Angeles Times, Boston Globe, Boston Herald, and Ceramics Monthly. She recently completed a large-scale permanent installation for the Airbnb Headquarters in San Francisco and published her book Recipes for Conceptual Clay (in the time of covid 19).
