









The world as we know is going through metamorphosis constantly and the millennials reflect and contemplate on these changes variously. In this crazy transformative period, time came to a standstill as pandemic conformed the world to their homes, at least to intimate spaces antagonizing the momentum of the new century. The group of young artists here are part of this change, and equally part of the constant that holds the change together.

Ajaysingh Bhadoriya's work is deeply indigenous, in context as well as material. Ajaysingh's works are sensitive to each of the narratives of people and cultures, while weaving his own delicate story in his works.

Swapnil Ragde's work post pandemic began revolving around childhood environments. His bright, happy, portrayal of childhood mavericks celebrates the freedom of new life against the backdrop of violence and death.

Harshad Khandre's current series has worked on contemporary interpretations of Indian myths through iconology. Harshad combines his classical form pedagogy in visual style while depicting stories like 'lingodbhava Shiva'; the Vishnu as boar-headed, Brahma as swan-headed have Greek god-like physique.

Yogesh Lokhande's current series of works is a funky, intelligent and satirical comment on postmodern diplomacy in Indian politics. Using the 'kitsch' as the language of his works, Yogesh creates shiny multi-limbed Demi-gods, reflecting on the larger than life significance acquired by superficial narratives.

Parmeshwar Chavan's works use the human eye as a metaphor for inward journey. Parmeshwar's delicate subtle paintings coax you to look within, transcending us to the immense lightness of being, migrating us to the realms of internal peace. The artists bring together the existence of being, the quantum of life with mediums encompassing the essential elements of nature-fire, earth, water, air and space; the Pancha Tattva.
