



Privileges and Responsibilities of an IAC Membership

Being an elected Member of the IAC provides evidence of excellency in the practice of the ceramic arts. The IAC affiliation provides Members with privileged access to an international community which promotes contemporary ceramics. The IAC has built up a large network of artists, writers, gallerists, museums and other entities including academic programs and artistic residencies. The interaction amongst Members promotes cross-cultural understanding and exchanges. Such collective contributions significantly advance ceramic creation worldwide.

- **As an IAC Individual Member in good standing, your membership gives you the right:**
 - to vote electronically (or in person during General Assemblies), and to elect Council Members and Members of the Executive;
 - to sponsor New Members;
 - to participate as an artist in the Members' Exhibition and to be listed in the catalogue every 2 years, subject to the exhibition criteria.
- **As an IAC Individual Member or Collective Member in good standing, you can:**
 - access the biannual bulletins;
 - access the IAC Network;
 - access the IAC website and its specific information for Members only;
 - have a personal webpage for the purpose of presenting your work on the IAC website, free of charge;
 - advertise events on the IAC Facebook page;
 - enjoy a discount on the registration fee for General Assemblies.

Responsibilities:

Your affiliation to the IAC entails certain responsibilities:

- To pay your annual fee **at the start of the calendar year** (so to remain in good standing).
- To keep your contact information up to date with the IAC Office.
- To participate in elections and votes.
