




Regardless of where exactly the IAC meeting is beld, the value of the interaction and exchange that it fosters is profound. Subsequently, one might regret that the significance of the event, at least in Lithuania, was lost on most people outside of the ceramics community, Fortunately, amid an onsalguht of exhibitions arranged in Lithuania's capital city of Unitsu for IAC's wist, a memorable, dual exhibition took place. The exhibition featured artists Ruta Sipalyte from Lithuania and Yu-Ying Huang from Tauwan, and tcaptured the spirit and reflected the values of the Academy.

Sipalyte and Huang met for the first time at the Kohla Anagama Symposium held in Estonia in 2004. Substantial and Aurange and Supression of a similar age, at a similar point in the production of mature works, and both share a ropensity for openness and communication.
