1994 TRIP TO JAPAN: A deeply moving and transformative experience.

Participating in a long trip to Japan organized by the Huara-Huara Workshop, where we visited studios and observed master ceramists, practicing traditional techniques. I learned how they listen to the material and observe nature with reverence. I was moved by the purity of their work: simple tools, humble spaces, coloured surfaces with local clays, minerals, and ash, and the firing of pieces in large hillside wood kilns. I discovered also love, humility, and respect for ceramics. This experience marked the beginning of a deep connection with the craft, the earth, nature, and the aesthetics of imperfection—echoes that now live in my own work.

2000 / Founding My Studio

I established my own studio, to create a space of creative freedom and autonomy, where I explore ceramics intuitively, without limitations, and develop a personal language rooted in my connection to the earth aesthetics.

A SPACE OF GATHERING "Objeto de Arte"

A place where I invited several ceramists to share, and the joy of practicing the craft. A small collective, where we work together, each one with her own style. One of the members was Tere Marín (member of the IAC). For many years we have shared an old house as a living workshop where we nurture exchange, dialogue, and learning. This has always been my refuge.

2005 / 2019.CERAMIC CLASSES A long the years, I taught ceramics in my studio, adapting me to diversity of the student needs. It was a rewarding experience of mutual learning, where I encouraged students to embrace the creative process and let go, the need for "perfection". What I taught them, was to love the creative process, and simply let go.

2017 / Until now CONTEMPORARY CERAMIC GALLERY SHOP

Along with another ceramist, I founded "TERREA", dedicated to showcasing artistically and technically excellent pieces, selected to represent the best of Chilean ceramic art. This space visited also by foreigners, offering them an experience that reflects the skill of local creators and the quality of ceramic works in Chile. Over time, we've received numerous testimonials and praise from visitors from around the world, who highlight the beauty of the space, the selection and quality of the works on display, and the fact that every object is a unique piece they can take home — carrying with them the spirit and creativity of Chilean contemporary ceramics.
